### **Strategic Procurement Outlook**

#### **Overview**

The Australian Federal Police (AFP) is a progressive and multi-faceted law enforcement organisation, taking a strong lead in the fight against 21st century crime.

By employing the core principles of prevention, deterrence, partnerships and innovation, the AFP strives to build a more secure future for Australia and its global partners. Counter-terrorism and national security are major business priorities, underpinned by an unprecedented focus on strategy and investment.

So too is the AFP's commitment to international relations, which drives inter-agency collaboration and enables the fight against transnational crime to be taken to its source. At a national level, the AFP continues to work successfully with the Australian Government and key agencies on a range of counter-terrorism, crime-fighting and capacity building initiatives.

The AFP is a truly global policing agency, committed to staying one step ahead in a rapidly evolving criminal environment.

The AFP is a budget funded agency within the Attorney-General's portfolio. As such, it is subject to the Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997 and Regulations, the Commonwealth Procurement Guidelines, the Australia-United States Free Trade Agreement (AUSFTA) and free trade agreements with Singapore, Thailand, and Chile, the Australian and New Zealand Closer Economic Relations Trade Agreement, and the ASEAN-Australia-New Zealand free trade agreement.

The AFP observes the procurement thresholds prescribed by the *Commonwealth Procurement Guidelines – December 2008*.

The AFP observes the legislation and Commonwealth Procurement Guidelines in all procurement activity it undertakes. This includes publishing all open approaches to the market on AusTender, and in the media (when considered helpful to the market). The AFP publishes details of contracts valued at \$10,000 or more on AusTender.

## **Reporting on Procurements during 2009-2010**

Request documentation for all open procurements will be available electronically through AusTender ([www.tenders.gov.au](http://www.tenders.gov.au)) when the AFP approaches the market. At this stage, the AFP does not accept electronic lodgement of tender responses.

All planned procurements are subject to revision or cancellation. Final decisions will not be made until each procurement has been initiated.

The information in this document is for planning purposes only, and it **does not** represent a pre-solicitation or constitute an invitation for bid or request for proposal, nor is it a commitment by the AFP to purchase the described supplies and services.
